things to know

The *Trail* has been laid out geographically to make it easier to cover the ground, with neighbouring artists grouped together, mostly within walking distance of each other. Take note of the fantastic outliers — for a change you could start at the ends and work your way back to the centre, and take advantage of the cafés and eateries along the way.

Stroud

The train and bus station are in the town centre and there are many bicycle parking rails. There are several car parks in the town centre and free parking is available in the streets away from the shopping areas.

Foot and pedal

Several venues are also accessible from the canal foot and cycle path or the old railway footpath and cycleway.

Painswick

Parking is available in the centre of this beautiful Cotswold village. Stamage's Lane car park is right next to the church and its famous yew trees.





At all points of the compass on the Autumn Arts Trail away from the town centre, there are artists and makers, often overlooked due to the distance, who will reward your journey.



ON THE EDGE



maxine relton

On the south-western edge of the Trail, on the road just a mile beyond the Annette Carding exhibition at Ruskin Mill's gallery (and their organic café and fish ponds) near Nailsworth, you'll arrive at Maxine Relton's studio in Horsley. The cottage is devoted to exhibiting her work, which includes sketchbooks

from her travels all over the world. The jewel is the studio in the garden where you can discover her fascinating process.

North-west of Stroud there's Randwick Woods and Haresfield Beacon. On the way, Jackie Garner's studio is in a quiet lane. In an area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, it'll become clear why she's one of the top wildlife artists in the country, her nature paintings sitting comfortably among her other works.

Lansdown Pottery is situated in nearby Whiteshill. Penny and John West converted farm outbuildings into their studio and showroom where they have developed functional stoneware techniques. John's wood and soda-fired ceramic pieces use locally found materials to create unique surfaces and textures.

Beyond Laurie Lee's famous Woolpack pub in Slad and through the woods north-east of Stroud, you'll come to Jack Everett's studio, perched on the woodland hillside. Experience the wild!



With no pattern or rules to follow, the aim is to weave quite freely, simply inhabiting each moment as it comes. Through Saori, we weave with our heart as well as our hands. Nicola will be demonstrating on the beautiful Japanese looms and exhibiting her weavings alongside work by local and Saori UK weavers. The Wayward Weaves Saori Studio is located at Weven, a not-for-profit initiative that supports makers and celebrates folklore alongside ancient techniques, country crafts and folk skills.





"We make two types of functional pottery intended for the home. The first is traditionally glazed and fired in a gas kiln to a high temperature, using glazes based on Japanese and Korean recipes. We also fire in a kiln using wood as the main fuel, where a soda vapour becomes a glaze over slips and glazes, some of which are using locally found natural materials and different wood ashes."







"Between traditional Indian woodblock on cloth, Japanese 'yaki-shiage' wood burning in architectural preservation and rolling dice, I have found a fertile avenue. This has led me to a technique of printmaking that I call 'blockpress print'. I make wooden shapes, largely geometrical to give myself an exacting framework from which I can diverge. These 3-D blocks I set on fire, removing the softer seasonal growth and leaving the harder slow growing signature rings. When these blocks are shaped on the lathe, for example, these growth rings display diagonally, and when the blocks become more sculptural, surprises emerge."



→ Out through Slad on the B4070, on through Bulls Cross, a further I.7 miles to a crossroad marked Miserden to the right, Sheepscombe left. Take the left turning to Sheepscombe, down the hill into the woods. Park 200 yards further on the left opposite a white fence and take the footpath up left into an old quarry. Ignore Satnav directions for ease of arrival. Access:




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
